Gifts – Part 3 Romans 12:7-8

12:7-8 - if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; 8 he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

- a. if service, in our serving;
 - a. service (διακονία diakonia διάκονος diakonos)- Technically, the word is what is used for a selected group of men called deacons, but it is not limited to that selected group who help the poor, help the sick, and perform many other services for the church.
 - i. Rom 16:1 I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a <u>servant</u> of the church at Cenchreae,
 - ii. Many brothers and sisters in the church have the gift and the heart of serving, and use it, whether it is seen or unseen.
- b. the one who teaches, in his teaching;
 - a. Teachers study in order to communicate truth to those they teach. Prior to the completion of the word of God, the teacher needed to remember what has been heard.
 - b. A prophet may also teach, but the truth they have was revealed to them.
 - c. Following the ending of spiritual gifts, such as prophecy, the distinction between prophet and teacher disappeared.
- c. the one who exhorts, in his exhortation;
 - a. exhort (παρακαλῶν *parakalōn*) This word was used in 12:1 as an urgent appeal. It can also mean "to encourage". In Acts 4:36, it is used in the name given to Barnabas son of encouragement.
 - i. Heb. 10:24 And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works,
- d. the one who contributes, in generosity;
 - a. generosity (ἁπλότητος haplotētos) simplicity, sincerity, purity of mind. In English, we think of generosity as an amount. In Greek, it is a quality – pure in mind, genuine in heart.
 - b. A widow gave two copper coins all that she had to live on (Luke 21:1-4).
 - c. 2 Cor. 9:7 Each one must give as he has <u>decided in his heart</u>, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

- d. For a special contribution for poor saints at Jerusalem, Paul asked the Corinthians to give as they had <u>prospered</u> (1 Cor. 16:1-2).
- e. the one who leads, with zeal;
 - a. zeal (σπουδῆ *spoudē*) earnestness, diligence, enthusiasm.
 - b. When we think of a shepherd, it is the sheep who follow, and they <u>trust</u> the shepherd.
 - c. A leader need not be a shepherd, but one who leads in any capacity is to be enthusiastic and one who will "not let grass grow under their feet".
- f. the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.
 - a. mercy (ἐλεέω eleeō) possible meaning is to feel sympathy toward the misery of another, especially sympathy that results in action.
 - b. cheerfulness (ἰλαρότητι *hilarotēti*) cheerfully, graciously, not grudgingly.
